Note

- Save all packing materials and the box in case for any reason you must ship your printer.
- The interface cable is not a standard accessory. Buy the appropriate interface cable for the interface you want to use (Parallel or Network).

USB cable

- Please make sure you use a USB 2.0 interface (Type A/B) cable that is no longer than 6 feet (2.0 meters).
- When you use a USB cable, make sure you connect it to the USB port of your computer and not to a USB port on a keyboard or non-powered USB hub.

Parallel cable

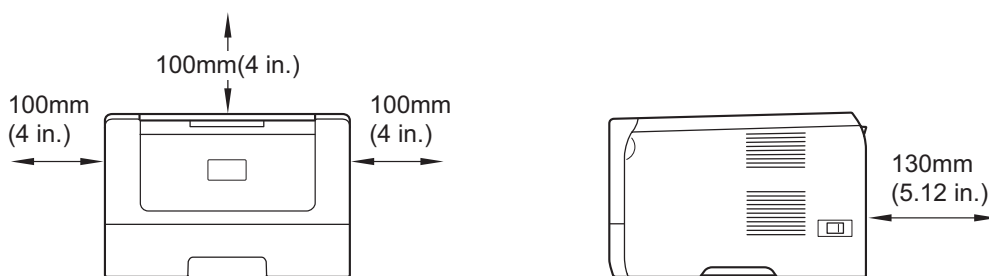
DO NOT use a parallel interface cable that is longer than 6 feet (2.0 meters). Use a shielded interface cable that is IEEE 1284-compliant.








Network cable (For LJ3650DN)

Use a straight-through Category5 (or greater) twisted-pair cable for 10BASE-T or 100BASE-TX Fast Ethernet Network.

**Note**

Keep a minimum gap around the printer as shown in the illustration.

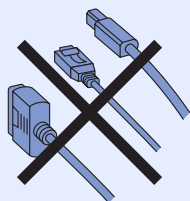

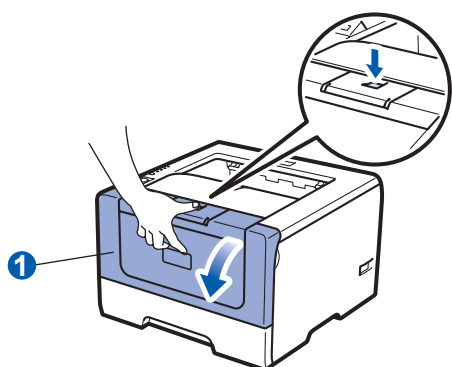

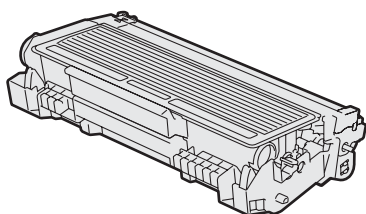


a Remove the packing tape from the outside of the printer.

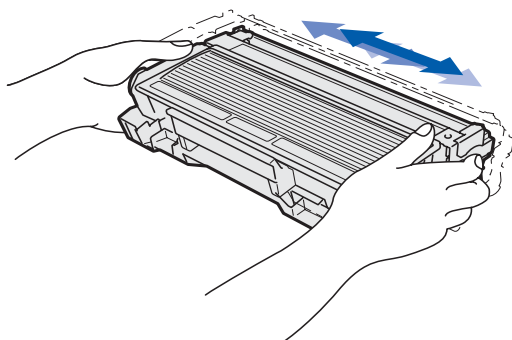
b Press the front cover release button and open the front cover ①.



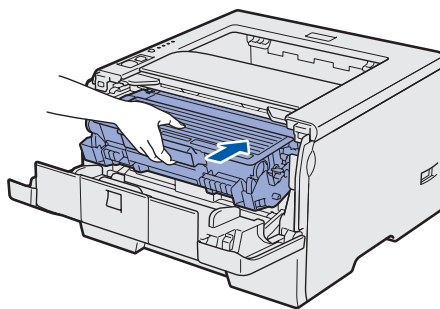
c Unpack the drum unit and toner cartridge assembly.



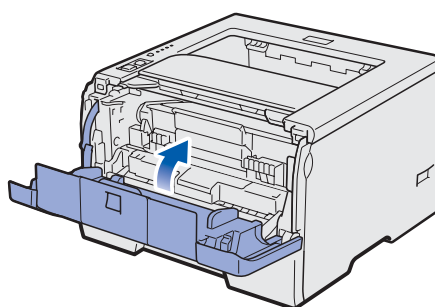
d Gently shake it from side to side several times to distribute the toner evenly inside the assembly.



e Put the drum unit and toner cartridge assembly into the printer until it clicks into place.



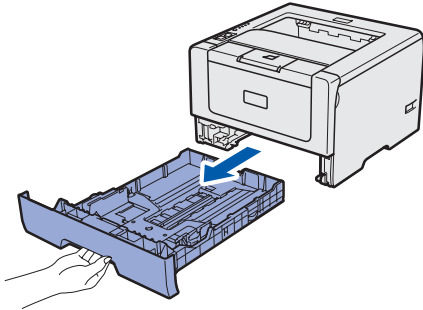

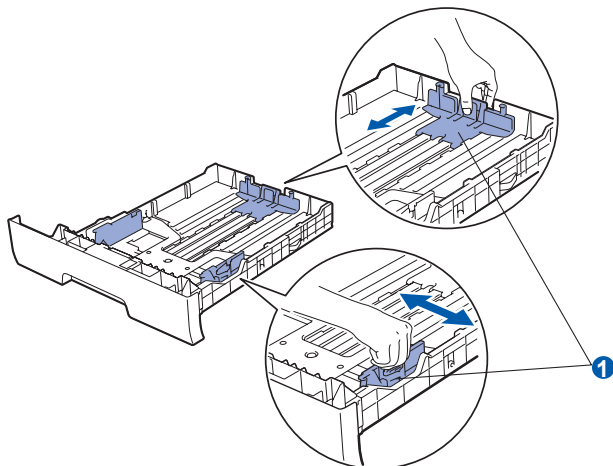

Load paper in the paper tray

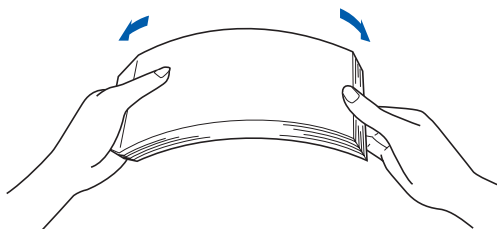
- a** Pull the paper tray completely out of the printer.



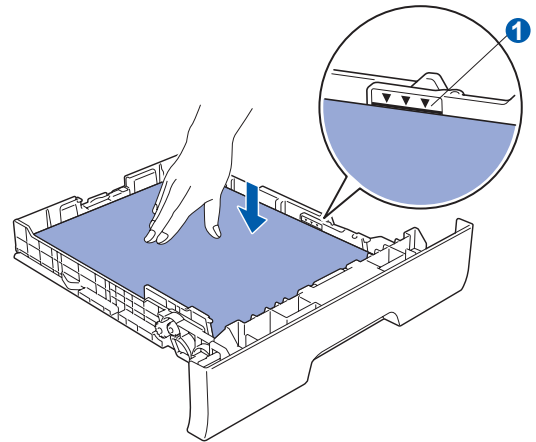
- b** While pressing the blue paper-guide release lever ①, slide the paper guides to fit the paper size you are loading in the tray. Make sure that the guides are firmly in the slots.



- c** Fan the stack of paper well to avoid paper jams and misfeeds.



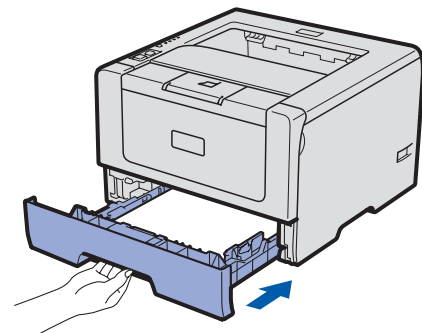
- d** Put paper in the tray, and make sure that the paper is below the maximum paper mark ①. The side to be printed on must be face down.



! IMPORTANT

Make sure the paper guides touch the sides of the paper so it will feed properly.

- e** Put the paper tray firmly back in the printer. Make sure that it is completely inserted into the printer.

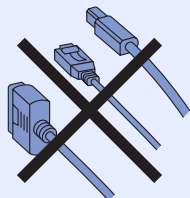

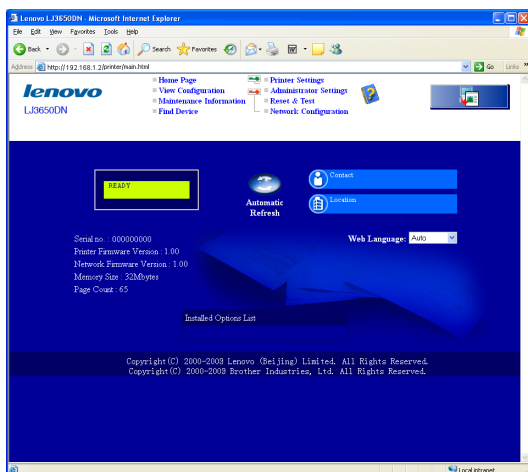
Web Based Management (web browser)

The Lenovo print server is equipped with a web server that allows you to monitor its status or change some of its configuration settings, using HTTP (Hyper Text Transfer Protocol).



Note

- The login name for the Administrator is '**admin**' (case sensitive) and the default password is '**access**'.
- We recommend Microsoft® Internet Explorer® 6.0 (or greater) or Firefox 1.0 (or greater) for Windows® and Safari 1.3 (or greater) for Macintosh. Please also make sure that JavaScript and Cookies are always enabled in whichever browser you use. To use a web browser, you will need to know the IP Address of the print server. The IP Address of the print server is listed on the Printer Settings Page.



a Start your web browser.

b Type `http://printer ip address/` into your browser.
(Where printer ip address is the IP Address or the print server name)

Reset the network settings to the factory default

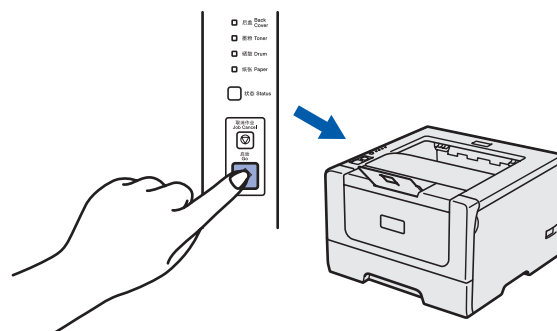
To reset all network settings of the print server to its factory default, follow the steps below.

- Turn off the printer.
- Make sure that the front cover is closed and the power cord is plugged in.
- Hold down **Go** as you turn on the power switch. Keep **Go** pressed down until the all LEDs light up and then **Status** LED turns up. Release **Go**. Make sure that all the LEDs turn off.
- Press **Go** six times. Make sure that all the LEDs light up to indicate the print server has been reset to its default settings. The printer will restart.

Print the Printer Settings Page

The Printer Settings Page lists all the current printer settings, including network settings. To print the printer settings page:

- Make sure that the front cover is closed and the power cord is plugged in.
- Turn on the printer and wait until the printer is in the Ready state.
- Press **Go** three times within 2 seconds. The printer will print the current printer settings page.



Note

If the IP Address on the Printer Settings Page shows **0.0.0.0**, wait for one minute and try again.

Safety precautions

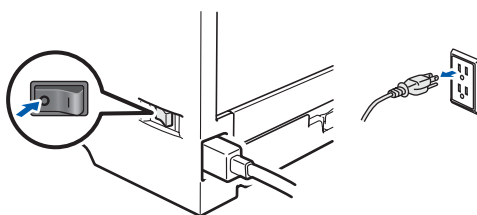
To use the printer safely

If you DO NOT follow these safety instructions, there is a possibility of a fire, electrical shock, burn or suffocation. Please keep these instructions for later reference and read them before attempting any maintenance.

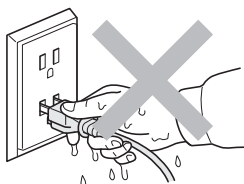
WARNING



There are high voltage electrodes inside the printer. Before you clean the inside of the printer, make sure that you have turned off the power switch and unplugged the printer from the AC power outlet.



DO NOT handle the plug with wet hands. Doing this might cause an electrical shock.



Always make sure the plug is fully inserted.

Plastic bags are used in the packaging. To avoid danger of suffocation, keep these bags away from babies and children.

DO NOT use flammable substances, any type of spray or any organic solvent/liquids containing alcohol or ammonia to clean the inside or outside of the printer. Doing this may cause a fire or electrical shock. Refer to *Chapter 6 of the User's Guide* for how to clean the printer.



DO NOT use a vacuum cleaner to clean up scattered toner. Doing this might cause the toner dust to ignite inside the vacuum cleaner, potentially starting a fire. Carefully clean the toner dust with a dry, lint-free cloth and dispose of it according to local regulations.

Cleaning the outside of the printer:

- Make sure that you have unplugged the printer from the AC power outlet.
- Use neutral detergents. Cleaning with volatile liquids such as thinner or benzene will damage the outside surface of the printer.
- DO NOT use cleaning materials that contain ammonia.

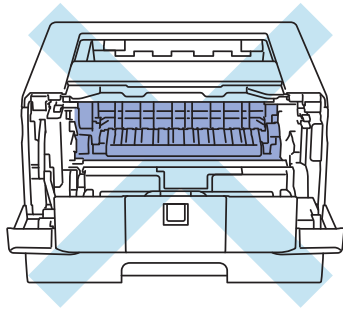

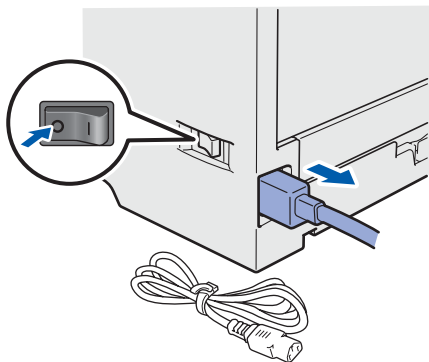
Shipment of the printer

1 Back Cover LED

The Back Cover LED indicates when errors occur in the back of the printer.

2 Toner LED

The Toner LED indicates when the toner is low or requires replacement.

3 Drum LED

The Drum LED indicates when the drum life will end soon, the drum is at the end of its life or the corona wire needs cleaning.

4 Paper LED

The Paper LED indicates when the paper tray is empty or there is a paper jam.

5 Status LED

The Status LED will be on/blink or change color depending on the printer status.

6 Job Cancel button

Stops and Cancels the print operation in progress.




7 Go button
